# THE FORTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE MERCANTILE ROWING CLUB.

Gentlemen.

Your Committee has pleasure in presenting to you the Forty-first Annual Report, together with a Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the past Season, and the Balance sheet as at the 31st July last,

#### Finance.

The receipts for the year totalled £585/6/10, showing an increase of £137/3/7 over last year's figures, and the expenditure amounted to £490/3/3, last year's total being exceeded to the extent of £57/17/2. The operations for the year disclose an excess of receipts over disbursements of £95/3/9, being a net increase over last year's operations of £79/6/7. The above figures are somewhat in the nature

of a record, and are easily the best for the last ten years.

Year after year your Committee draws attention to the item

"Repairs to boats, etc," but still the amount increases, and this year's

Statement shows the large sum of £89/10/11 as having been expended on that account. To remember when handling boats and oars that it is your property should be sufficient, and your Committee urges you to take heed of this advice. The large amount paid for insurance is due to the re-adjustment of the policies, whereby the amount paid

covers a period of 21 months.

The subscriptions have been well maintained, but your Committee considers the amount of £31/13/6 should not be outstanding, and urges those members responsible to pay, in order that the Club may meet the heavy expenditure for new boats on order.

# Membership.

The Club has had a fair share of the prosperity which Rowing Clubs generally throughout the State experienced in enrolling new

members, as during the season 55 new members were elected by it.

The Members' Roll has been revised frequently by your Committee, and our strength is now 147 members, as against last year's

total of 103, and is made up as follows:-

The Club is to be congratulated on its success in regard to membership, and the large increase in the Roll is a source of great satisfaction to your Committee, though entailing a good deal of extra work on the Executive Officers

#### **Boats and Oars.**

The Practice Fleet has been extensively used throughout the season, as may be presumed by the large increase in membership, and in the circumstances has stood very well. But your Committee, in view of the age and condition of the Practice Fours ordered three new Fours from Messrs. Jas. Edwards and Son, at a cost of £135, to replace

the old boats, and they are now almost ready for delivery.

The Clinker Racing Eights—"A. B. Sloan" and "Edward Kenny" (Wharparilla)—have been sold. The Club is now the possessor of the following boats:—RACING—1 Best Eight; 2 Best Fours; 1 Clinker Eight; 2 Clinker Fours; 2 Pairs; 1 Sculling Boat. PRACTICE—3 Clinker Eights; 3 Clinker Fours; 2 Pairs; 2 Sculling Boats. The oars are in good condition, and comprise 24 Racing and 54 Practice. Three sets of oars are on order, and early delivery is expected. The Club, therefore, is fortunate in having a good supply with which to commence the coming season.

#### Rowing.

# Australian Championships.

The Eight-Oared Championship of the Commonwealth took place at Launceston on the 25th April last, between the six States, and resulted in the Western Australian crew winning its first championship by three-quarters of a length from the Tasmanian crew, in the record time of 14 min. 37 sec. The Victorian crew finished third. Your members—J. M. Buchanan, R. V. Gregg and J. Harding—were selected to row, but the former resigned his seat for business reasons. Your Captain, Mr. E. Kenny, was again appointed Manager of the Victorian crew.

The Sculling Championship was won by G. A. Westbrook (Tas.), the Victorian representative, J. Barton, finishing second.

# **Intervarsity Championship**

The annual contest for the above was rowed at Brisbane on the 31st May last, and resulted in the Melbourne University winning by half a length from Queensland, the other crews being 10 and 14 lengths away respectively. Your members—J. M. Buchanan and R. H. Keon-Cohen—rowed in the stroke and No. 2 seats respectively.

# Association Championship.

Champion Fours, 13th November, 1920.

Your Club represented by H. Smyth (bow), J. Harding (2), R. V. Gregg (3), and J. L. Mounsey (stroke), with E. Counihan as cox, was successful in winning this race from six other crews. The Club's last win was in the 1906-7 season.

#### Champion Pairs, 15th January, 1921.

H. Smyth (bow) and J. M. Buchanan (stroke), with E. Counihan as cox, represented the Club, but, after qualifying, were unsuccessful in the final heat. The race was won by the Footscray City Club from Albert Park, with your Club's representatives in third place.

Shaw as cox, was deprived of first place in the last 20 yards by the Civil Service Club, who won by three feet, Corio Bay being third, some two lengths away.

W. C. Harvey represented your Club, but was unsuccessful, the Richmond Club winning through the agency of J. Barton. Your Club heartily extends its congratulations to all of the successful crews and scullers.
