THE SIXTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

of the

Mercantile Rowing Club

31st July, 1943.

To the Members of Mercantile Rowing Club :

Gentlemen,—Your Committee has much pleasure in presenting the Sixty-Third Annual Report together with audited Balance Sheet covering the twelve months ended 30th June, 1943.

Further enlistments during the season have increased the number of members serving in the Forces to 154. We were very pleased to see so many of them present at the sheds during their leave.

It was also pleasing to see many interstate and country Servicemen put in an appearance at the week-ends.

Inter-Club racing was further restricted, and your Club was well represented in all events.

Combination racing was also on a reduced scale, and Club racing was confined to the "Sprigg Time Trial."

However, in spite of the fact that competitive rowing is to a large extent debarred, the sport still has a great deal to offer those who wish to gain the undoubted benefits derived from one or two regular rows each week. Every facility will be extended to those members who desire occasional exercise and relaxation.

Social activities were confined to a "Christmas social" and a golf match.

Financial.

The Committee is appreciative of the staunch support accorded by members during the season, more especially perhaps by the Old Brigade.

The amount of subscriptions is large, but in this connection it might be well to consider the effect of the war on incomes, and also the difficulty a section of our members have in maintaining contact with the Shed.

It will be observed that a new item, "War Bond," appears in our assets. The Committee felt that the Federal Treasurer should receive the maximum support during the recent War Loan appeals.

Expenditure has been under strict control by the Committee in view of the difficult times ahead. It is expected that the cost of repairs and new boats in the future will be very much higher than we are accustomed to.

Executive and Committee.

Our thanks are again due to Mr. A. Gordon for the able manner in which he has carried out his duties as Captain. The sound position of the Club at the present time is due in a large degree to his untiring and enthusiastic work.

Our thanks are also due to Mr. A. Clarke for his splendid work as Treasurer. He has now occupied this position with great credit both to himself and to the Club for the past 28 years. We hope that he will be able to carry on for many years to come.

Since the enlistment in the R.A.A.F. of your Vice-Captain, Mr. J. Robertson, his duties have been capably carried out by Messrs. E. Varcoe and J. Blair Holt.

Addendum.

Obituary.

By the death of Mr. R. A. Cooper, Senr., father of your esteemed member, Dr. R. A. Cooper, Mercantile has lost a valued friend and supporter. His association with the Club extended over a period of 40 years. It was brought about by the keen interest which his wife took in its welfare. She rendered invaluable services in connection with our social activities. On her untimely death, Mr. Cooper continued his interest, and for many years was one of your Vice-Presidents. The fact that his son served the Club first as a coxswain, then as a sculler and oarsmen, and later as coach added to his interest. His passing is felt particularly by the older members of the Club who knew of, and were greatly appreciative of, the great services rendered to it by the Cooper family.

Another link with the past has been broken by the death, at Canberra, of Mr. E. Yandell, financial secretary to the Commonwealth Treasury. In the years 1905 to 1908, Mr. Yandell was a keen member of the Club, and he had a successful rowing career. Pressure of work, and his transfer to Canberra, put an end to his active rowing, but like many other oarsmen long since resident in the Federal Capital, he was always interested in the welfare of the Club. The news of his death was received with much regret, especially by those of his contemporaries who still remain in the Club.
