### THE SIXTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

### Mercantile Rowing Club

To the Members of the Mercantile Rowing Club:

Gentlemen,—Your Committee has much pleasure in submitting for your consideration the Sixty-seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet.

The promise shown last year when your Club finished second in the Premiership has been fulfilled with the winning of the Junior Premiership. However, as a Club, we do not intend to rest on this success, but in the coming year we will aim to bring both the Senior and Junior Premierships to Mercantile. Therefore it should be our endeavour to strengthen the successful junior crews of this year and place the Club once again to the fore in Senior rowing. During the year our membership has increased considerably, and among the new members we have many strong and promising novices to whom we look for assistance in retaining the Junior Premiership.

At the commencement of the season we hoped to add an eight and a four to our fleet, thanks to the generosity of Messrs. J. T. Dunstan, R. W. Thursfield, and the late G. Hastie, but despite our every endeavour this has been impossible, due to the large demand for boats in Australia, and the scarcity of competent boat builders. Mr. L. L. B. Moll, with a small band of willing workers, has done a magnificent job in keeping the fleet maintenanced and serviceable. In order to obtain the full use of our equipment in the present period of scarcity, a new bow has been successfully built on to the clinker racing eight "A. R. Shannon," and the Best & Best eight "R. V. Gregg" has been recommissioned and will be ready for racing in the coming season.

Prior to the commencement of racing in the 1947-48 Season, we expect delivery of 24 tubular racing oars, ten of which are being imported from "Ayling," England. The Ayling oars have been very generously donated by Mr. R. W. Thursfield.

For the second successive year Victoria has won the King's Cup, and a great deal of credit is once again due to Mr. W. R. B. Todd, who coached the successful crews.

The social side of the Club's activities has been well patronised, a very popular function being Ladies' Day, at which there was a large attendance. Afternoon tea was served in the gymnasium.

Many points for the premiership were gained at country regattas, and it was pleasing to see large numbers of young members attending these popular fixtures. The hospitality of the country clubs is well known to most members, and visitors to the country regattas this year

received the same hearty hospitality as in former years. The transport of boats and members to these regattas by parlour coach was of great assistance to the success of the journeys.

A more detailed report of the Club's activities for the past season

is submitted for review.

### Financial.

The amount of subscriptions received during the season was well above the average for the pre-war years.

However, the levy of £63 imposed by the V.R.A. for the King's Cup Crew, and rising costs of repairs to boats and oars have been a heavy drain on Club funds.

Once again, generous donations have been received from numerous members, which have been a great help to Club finances.

The Treasurer would greatly appreciate assistance from all members by their prompt payment of this year's subscription.

### Executive and Committee.

The loss of our late Treasurer, Mr. C. A. R. Clarke, during the year was a severe blow to the Club. Mr. J. N. Robertson was appointed by the Committee to the position, and has applied himself industriously to his important task. Mr. K. Bilney was appointed to the resulting vacancy on the Committee.

It will be noticed that the clinker racing eight "A. R. Shannon" and the practice eight "A. B. Sloan" reappear in the list of the fleet after an absence of some years, both these boats having been recommissioned in order to counteract the present difficulty of obtaining fleet replacements.

The work of converting the fleet to swivels as new oars are purchased is being continued, and at least two more eights should be converted prior to the commencement of racing in the coming season.

There has been a considerable loss of oars by breakage, partly due to the age of the oars, but also caused by careless handling.

It cannot be stressed too strongly the care which must be exercised in the use of both fleet and oars, particularly now that it is so difficult and costly to obtain replacements and repairs.

### Coaching.

The Club is indebted to those members who have devoted so much time to the coaching of crews throughout the season. We all realise the time devoted by the coaches to this important phase of the sport—very often time which they can ill afford—and we welcome this opportunity to express our appreciation of their work and sacrifice in imparting to the oarsmen of to-day the necessary knowledge to gain success in the sport of rowing.

Two old members in Messrs. J. L. Mounsey and P. M. Wade, who have rendered service to the Club over a long period reappeared among the coaches in order to assist the Club at a difficult time. At great inconvenience to their private interests they made themselves available, and we appreciate the affection for the club and the sport which prompted their action, and are glad to record the success which resulted from their labours.
