The Eighty-Sixth Annual Report

of the

Mercantile Rowing Club

To the Members.

Gentlemen,

Your committee has pleasure in submitting to you the 86th Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April, 1966.

In our season's rowing, the Lightweight crews secured for the Club the Lightweight Premiership, whilst we were runners-up in the Senior and Junior Premierships. At this stage, we would like to offer our congratulations to the Banks and Yarra Yarra Rowing Clubs who won the Senior and Junior Premierships respectively.

We are pleased to be able to report of the Club's participation and success in assisting Victoria to regain the King's Cup, of the Club gaining three of the five Victorian wins at the Third National Regatta at Ballarat on 29th and 30th April, 1966, and the Lightweight Four (as a supporting event) at the International Regatta at Ballarat on 20th November, 1965.

It should be recorded at this juncture, our thanks to those gentlemen who made the International Regattas with the New Zealand contingent and the Third National Regatta possible.

Again, during the season, trips were made by the Club crews to Sydney to gain additional racing experience, and your committee are sure that these visits not only assist our rowing and racing form, but also strengthen our crew and Club spirit.

From the Christmas period onwards, our ranks were strengthened by oarsmen leaving school and your committee, whilst always looking for likely and competent young oarsmen, welcome any suggestions and ideas from members.

It was with regret that we received two resignations from the committee during the season. They were Messrs. P. K. Watkin (November, 1965) and J. R. Harvey (April, 1966), who both expressed their regret that they were not able to give their respective offices the amount of time to properly carry out their functions. We do thank these members for the work that they have done for the Club during their years of service, trust that they will continue to help us as in the past. The vacancy caused by Mr. Watkin was filled by Mr. R. Negri and, due to the lateness in the season, your committee did not fill the second vacancy.

At the King's Cup in Hobart on 25th and 26th March, 1966, Victoria were successful in winning the King's Cup, the President's Cup and the Penrith Cup.

Your Club was represented in the King's Cup crew by — D. H. Boykett, M. G. Tomanovits, M. D. McKenzie, G. H. Boykett and R. J. Garrard, with T. Daffy as coxswain and D. Palfreyman as emergency. The crew was coached by Mr. H. R. Frederico.

To those who were fortunate enough to witness the race, to those who saw it on television and those who heard the race broadcast, it will be agreed that this was one of the most magnificent King's Cup races seen for many years.

Our congratulations go to the Tasmanian Rowing Council for their excellent organisation and hospitality. The course at Franklin on the Huon, 35 miles out of Hobart, was an excellent choice.

At the time of going to press with this report, we are advised that the Grading Committee of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council have recommended that the eight, under the direction of Mr. Frederico, and the N.S.W. Coxed Four represent Australia at the World Championships to be held at Bled, Yugoslavia, in August, 1966. The crew has also been invited to row in America on their way to Bled. No doubt, it will fall part of our task over the next few months to raise funds to finance this contingent.

Whilst there was a marked increase in the Junior ranks in the recruitment of members, the committee found itself responsible to write off a number of unfinancial members.

Financial

The Club's accounts for the season disclose a surplus of \$946. This has resulted in part from the higher subscription rates which became effective at the beginning of the season and which produced an increase in revenue of the anticipated figure of approximately \$800. The successful result has also been due to the steady support by members of the Club's social activities and, not least, to the continued assistance of the many members who contribute to the Club's funds by personal donations, be they large or small. Their names will appear elsewhere in this report.

The higher revenue and limited expenditure on new equipment enabled the Club to reduce substantially the large bank overdraft incurred last season.

In order to maintain our fleet at a size and standard adequate for our membership, new boats and oars will have to be purchased in this coming and future seasons, and members are therefore urged once again to pay their subscription promptly and to support the Club in all activities.
