THE NINETY EIGHT ANNUAL REPORT of the MERCANTILE ROWING CLUB

To the Members.

Your Committee has pleasure in submitting the 98th Annual Report and Financial Statement for the year ending 30th April, 1978.

Senior rowing under co-coaches Phil Cayzer and John Nickson with a large squad of oarsmen got off to a very promising start.

A rigorous weight and running circuit was engaged in through winter, and early success was enjoyed by the Senior 8 in winning 4 races up till the Negambie Regatta on Boxing Day, including a good win over last year's title holders — Monash University — at the Banks Regatta. Their string of wins then came to an end, and the crew recorded a disappointing fourth at the State Championships behind Monash, Sydney and Melbourne University.

Despite this end result we were fortunate in having four members of the 8 in the Kings Cup Crew: Steve Shirrefs rowing bow, Rod Guy(2), Alec Sloan (3) and Andrew Withers (6). These men will form the basis of next year's Senior 8, and we urge all Senior and potential Senior oarsmen to pay close attention to training programmes so that next year, with our added experience, we shall be able to topple the title holders.

It is very disappointing to report the end of an era of Lightweight domination by Mercantile in Australian rowing when this year, fielding two Lightweight 8s, the club recorded a second and fifth place at the Nationals Regatta. With more active lightweights in the club than ever before and a keeness second to none, there was a lack of unity in their approach. It was the opinion of many members that the best oarsmen were distributed between the two crews, and this was no way of beating a vastly improved Melbourne University.

Our congratulations to Dennis Hatcher, Ian Porter and Mal Robertson together with coach, David Palfreyman, who gained Australian selection to contest the World Lightweight 8 Championships to be held in Copenhagen in August.

The Club would like to wish every success to the Lightweight Crews competing in Copenhagen, as well as the Heavyweight Crews competing at the World Championships in New Zealand later this year, and reminds all members and their friends that their support in sending these crews is much needed and appreciated.

A special mention must be made of Marty Owen, Phil Ainsworth and Dick Garrard who were involved in a serious car accident in Tasmania driving from the river at Huonville after learning of their selection in the Australian squad. All three had an excellent chance of being in the crew, but injuries sustained as a result of the accident were an end to their hopes. For Phil and Dick it would have been the second year in succession of representing Australia in the 8, but for Marty it was the culmination of years of devoted training and service to Mercantile and rowing in general. As news of the accident spread, everyone who has antyhing to do with rowing felt for Marty, and on behalf of all Mercantilians we wish him well in his fight back and hope to see him reach his goal in 1979.

The Australian Lightweight 8 competing in the World Championships at Amsterdam last year, under coach Justice Frederico, and with a further six Mercantile members in the crew: Mal Robertson, Phil Ainsworth, Rod Stewart, Ian Porter, Dick Garrard and John Hawkins performed creditably to win a bronze medal behind England and Spain. The Club congratulates

the crew on their success, and the Mercantilians who helped re-establish Mercantile in world class rowing.

The club also wishes to congratulate another of its members — Peter Benjamin — on his excellent performance in gaining a silver medal at the Maccabean Games sculling for Australia.

Junior rowing, under coach John Burford, seems likely to be a strong force in the future with a crew which dominated Maiden rowing early in the season but lacked experience in the junior class. The crew shows an excellent basis for next year in both Senior and Junior class with many capable oarsmen ready and eager to make a success in rowing.

David Douglas stirred up an amazing reaction in the Maiden ranks and boated a Maiden 8 and two Maiden 4s in the latter part of the season, and had to call on the help of Jack Shanasy in handling the number of keen oarsmen.

Roger Wilson's Brighton Grammar crew and Martin Tomanovit's Xavier College crew attained much success in rowing for the club in the Novice class in the early part of the season, and we hope that many of these lads will come to Mercantile after they leave school and further their success with the club.

Ted Sorani, together with the help of a number of club members, set out on a task to raise money for the Club by making and selling fibre-glass canoes. These canoes were of a very high standard and realised \$320. We would like to thank Ted for his untiring support for the Club.

Bob Aitken has taken on the position of Chairman of the Centenary Committee. All members are reminded that the Centenary is only two years away, and any points of interest or ideas should be relayed to Bob for his action.

FINANCIAL: The club is maintaining its sound financial position thanks mainly to the many generous donations received during the year.

Unfortunately the surplus of \$4,134 for the year was not realised in funds as outstanding subscriptions \$1,038 and outstanding entry fees of \$383 have deprived the Club of the opportunity to make a substantial reduction in the overdraft of \$23,000, the servicing of which takes a large portion of the subscription income. The slow payment of subscriptions and entry fees is a handicap to the planning of equipment replacement and reduction of overdraft and all members are urged to make an effort to meet their financial obligations to the Club.

DONATIONS: With the high cost of boats and oars, the subscriptions of members are insufficient to provide vital new equipment and it is the generosity of friends and members which make possible the purchase of the necessary new equipment and the upgrading of the Club facilities.

We are particularly grateful to Caltex Oil (Australia) Pty. Ltd. for a substantial donation which enabled the purchase of a new convertible coxed/coxless racing four.

The relining of the Memorial Club Room, which is now in progress has been made possible by generous donations from Mrs. Alice Stirling and Mr. Colin Stirling, widow and brother of our esteemed late member, David Stirling.

A Regulation 4 and Lightweight 8 are on order from Sykes for delivery in August and October respectively. The pair oared boat, the 'Keith Bilney' was sold for \$250-00.
