There we met some members of the London Rowing Club which was celebrating its 125th Anniversary. We were entertained at the Remenham and Leander Clubs and greatly admired the organisation of the Regatta and its surroundings.

All members taking part in the trip thoroughly enjoyed it and agreed its success was greatly due to the organising ability of Bob Aitken.

The experience gained by our executive officers in recent years gave us a sound administration and a glance at the personnel of the Kings Cup crew and the Youth Eight at the National Regatta shows the value of that administration.

We now have considerable depth of oarsmen in the various groups and look forward to even better results in the future.

To The Members,

Your committee has pleasure in submitting the 102nd Annual Report and Financial Statement for the year ending 30th April, 1982.

In a successful season marked by many notable achievements, the highlights were undoubtedly the win by our Senior Eight in the State Championship (the first since 1970) and the win by our Senior B Eight at the National Titles.

Despite recording over seventy race wins the Club could only finish second in the Champion Club, and the Senior and Junior Premierships. The large number of Open race wins was a contributing factor to this result.

Our international representatives performed most creditably — the four coxed by Mike Sim recorded a string of wins in Europe before finishing sixth in the World Championships in Munich. The women's pair coached by David Palfreyman achieved a similar result. The Senior B four with lan Belot in the bow seat performed well to finish fifth in their final. The Junior four coached by Mike Manley, with Glenn Deag (bow), Graham Barns (cox), and Greg Pechan caused much excitement at home before having to be content with fourth place.

Our Senior oarsmen, under coach Peter Philp, enjoyed the most successful season that Mercantile has had at this level for many years. Mercantile crews dominated Senior and Open racing for the first half of the season culminating in the exciting win in the State Championship. Our crew, Alan Borger (bow), Jeff Lawrence, John Sabljak, Mark Doyle, David Doyle, Stewart Moreton, Neil Myers, Ion Popa (str.), Mike Sim (cox) defeated Melbourne University by one metre in the new record time of 5:49.5 for the Ballarat course. This time eclipsed the old record by five seconds. All except Sabljak and Border were then selected to represent

Victoria in the Kings Cup. Two weeks later, a Mercantile four (rowing by invitation) won the Champion Fours by a large margin and the Doyle brothers convincingly won the Coxless Pairs Championship. Unfortunately, success largely eluded our Senior oarsmen from this point on, although Ion Popa stroked a composite four to victory at the National Titles. Mercantile has had representatives in the winning crew in this event four times in the last six years. At the conclusion of the National Regatta, the Doyle brothers, David and Mark, were successful in gaining international selection as a pair at Senior B level, and to them, we extend our congratulations. For Mark it represents a remarkable achievement in that he left school a bare six months ago. A rapid rise indeed!

Our pre-Christmas Junior Eight attained a high standard under coach Alex Sloan before being denied racing by an absence of entries for their event. The good basis established in this crew combined with new blood formed our very strong Youth Eight which, under Mike Manley, dominated rowing for a short period before being beaten by a canvas by a South Australian crew in their State Championship. We congratulate the following members who were selected in the Victorian Youth Eight:—

Mike Manley (coach), Graham Barns (cox), Doug Scown (str.), Greg Pechan, Tasso Paxinos, Marty O'Halloran, Joe Joyce, Peter Howe, Gary Harris and Grant Atkins.

Our Championship Junior Eight enjoyed some good races with Corio Bay before being defeated by that crew in the State Championships, rowed in very heavy head conditions not suited to such a light crew. Members of this crew went on to row in the Senior B Eight coached by Marty Owen that was so successful at the National Titles. The crew: David Watson, Paul Fitzpatrick, Ian Rycroft, Barry Thomas, Derek Mollison, Cameron Hall, Glenn Deag, Alan Borger (str.), Mark Gishen (cox) defeated the Victorian Youth Eight in a close race. In a demonstration of the strength of the Club at this level, third place in this race was 13 seconds behind!

The decline in our lightweight ranks, evident for several seasons became terminal in February when the four coached by Noel Donaldson broke up. This marked the retirement from active rowing of the irrepressible Marty Owen, who was for so long a stalwart in lightweight ranks at Mercantile. Marty, however, was not to be deterred and within six weeks had notched his first National Title as coach!

Maiden oarsmen under the supervision of Nick Newton were successful in many races and particularly prominent in eights and fours in the latter part of the season. We look forward to their achievements next season. A good season for our novice oarsmen climaxed with five wins at the Easter Regattas. Despite some unfortunate setbacks this group coached by Vic Ronai-Horvath produced some excellent rowing.

Mercantile's prominence in all levels of rowing was extended this season to include Veteran events. A strong 'young' group led by Phil Ainsworth and Terry Phillips dominated events in their division including a resounding win in the Head-of-the-Yarra recording eight fastest time overall!

In conclusion, the Club enjoyed a very strong season with improved results in most divisions. We have an enthusiastic group of young oarsmen equipped with the best fleet in Victoria and coached by some of the States' best available men. In the words of our president, Mr. Sprigg, Mercantile is once again becoming "The Mecca of Rowing".

BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

In line with the Club's policy to provide a high quality fleet, balanced to suit the needs of all members, the extraordinary growth of the past two seasons has continued.

The following major items of new equipment were purchased during the season:

The ROGER B. WILSON is a convertible four suited for use by light-weight oarsmen.

The R.H. RICHARDSON is a coxed four of medium design built with a modern 'plastic' skin.

A set of ten 12' 6" skyes oars was purchased for general use.

It is intended to purchase another four and a coxless pair in the coming season in addition to another set of ten blades to provide Mercantile members with a fleet that is certainly beyond peer in Victoria and perhaps Australia.

Much renovation work was carried out during the season with Lindsay Wallis and Andrew Guerin deserving special mention for their efforts.

Maintenance is a continuing job, and all oarsmen are urged to look after and help maintain their equipment. The life of our equipment must be stretched to help reduce the strain on our already well-stretched financial resources.

ROWING - GENERAL

RECRUITING:

Again the Club was successful in recruiting a number of Novice, Maiden, Junior and Youth oarsmen. The recruiting sub-committee headed by Brian Doyle put in many hours of hard work to reap a most satisfactory result. The Annual Recruiting Day was held on Sunday, September 24th, when prospective recruits were given the chance of rowing with the Club's oarsmen in a relaxed atmosphere.

COACHING:

The sound base established in 1980/81 came to fruition this season when our large group of oarsmen at varying standards were most capably handled by an effective cohesive group of coaches.

Peter Philp ably managed the Senior squad and went on to coach the Kings Cup crew. Noel Donaldson looked after the lightweights. Our junior crews were coached at various stages by Alex Sloan, Marty Owen, Andrew Guerin and Phil Ainsworth. The maiden group were under the supervision of Nick Newton and Vic Ronai-Horvath coached the novice squad. Marty Aitken coached the F.I.S.A. Junior squad.

HEAD OF THE RIVER 1982:

In one of the closest finishes in the history of the race Melbourne Grammar School, coached by Mr. Tony Smith, were successful for the fourth year in a row, this time though, by one foot to Carey and a further six inches to St. Kevins. The final followed two equally close and thrilling semi-finals.
