I congratulate those who were successful and particularly, those whose efforts were rewarded by the Australian selectors.

The work of our Captain and Committee and of those who assisted by personal endeavour, on and off the water, financial support and long standing interest in the Club's welfare, is not only important, but essential to success. I thank them all on your behalf for their enthusiasm and support.

It is one thing to achieve the honour of Champion Club, it is another to retain it. At such a time we should do well to remember that fundamentally, success comes from what we are, - a Club where the crews, now both men and women who race for Mercantile in every category from Novice to Veteran are all part of the Club and equally as important to the future of the Club as those who wear Victorian and Australian Blazers. If we can all maintain the Mercantile spirit of determination, co-operation and endeavour, which has produced the results of last season, there is no reason why we cannot maintain our present significant position in Australian rowing. Let us strive to do so.

#### TO THE MEMBERS

Your Committee has pleasure in submitting the 105th Annual Report and Finance Statement for the year ending 30th April, 1985.

With the outstanding success achieved at the National Championships and Kings Cup Regatta, where we won seven National Championship events, the Club concluded one of its most successful seasons ever. We are again the Champion Club of Victoria, also winning the Senior and Lightweight Premierships.

Our success speaks for itself. Eighteen of our members, oarsmen and coaches, have been selected in Australian crews which will be competing in international regattas over the forthcoming months.

Congratulations must also go to those oarsmen who represented the Club in Australian crews prior to the commencement of the 1984/85 season. Sam Patten rowed the heavyweight eight which won the bronze medal at the Los Angeles Olympics - a fantastic result! David Doyle also rowed at Los Angeles competing in the heavyweight coxless four. Representing the Club in the Senior B tour against New Zealand, Glen Deag rowed in the eight while Martin Owen coached his coxless lightweight four of Alan Borger, Derek Mollison, Joe Joyce and Greg Pechan. This crew remained undefeated throughout the whole of their tour. Phil Ainsworth and his Australian Fisa Junior Four of Stephen Hair, Peter Tomanovits, Stuart Wade and Bob Law competed at the World Fisa Junior Championships held in Sweden and won the bronze medal. A great result for which they deserve our congratulations.

David Palfreyman was kept busy in Canada coaching the Australian Senior Lightweight eight. Due to unfortunate illness during that tour, David's crew was unable to perform to the best of its ability.

At the beginning of the 1984/85 season David Palfreyman was appointed to again coach the senior eight on his return from Canada. They raced very successfully in lead up regattas to the State Championships which were held at Ballarat, just prior to Christmas. At this regatta they were defeated by a composite crew from Melbourne University, Corio Bay and Ballarat Wendouree. But as a result of their fine performances throughout the season seven members of our senior eight and the coxswain were selected in the state squad from which the Kings Cup crew was to be selected. These members were: David Doyle, Mark Doyle, James Tomkins, Ian Belot, Neil Myers, Paul Thompson, Peter Tomanovits and Robbie Forsyth. Also selected in the state squad were Richard Howden and Martin O'Halloran who at that stage had been rowing in our Senior B eight which had also been producing some fine performances. Out of a total squad of twe—lve oarsmen and two coxswains, Mercantile was represented by ten members.

The Victorian Kings Cup squad competed in fours and pairs at each National Selection regatta leading up to the National Championships. Some very fine performances were recorded during this time by Mercantile members in the squad. These results led to the following six members being selected in the Victorian heavyweight eight: Martin O'Halloran, Paul Thompson, David Doyle, Mark Doyle, James Tomkins, Ian Belot.

In a tremendous race the Victorian crew went on to win the Kings Cup in very fine style.

It was a marvellous result for our senior oarsmen and we congratulate them all for an outstanding performance. Further congratulations go to James Tomkins and Ian Belot who were subsequently selected in the Australian Senior A eight oared crew. Paul Thompson was also selected to represent Australia as a member of the Senior B eight oared crew. It was also good to see another well known Mercantilian, Phil Cayzer, selected to coach the Australian Senior crew. Phil, who now lives in Sydney, coached many successful senior Mercantile crews and it is great to see him back at Mercantile where the crew will be training prior to going overseas.

This season has seen great emphasis being placed on under age rowing namely the Senior B, Youth and Fisa Junior crews. Prior to the commencement of the season, Tim Frederico assisted by David Pincus supervised a very thorough and successful recruiting drive which resulted in the club attracting a great number of very high quality schoolboy recruits. These new members went on to form the nucleus of our Youth eight and Fisa Junior four.

Martin Aitken was appointed coach of the Senior B eight. Throughout the season, this group of young oarsmen, the majority of whom had rowed in the very successful Champion Youth eight from last season, continually produced outstanding results both at regular regattas held throughout the season and also in fours and pairs at the National Selection regattas. The crew consisted of Andrew Cooper, Stewart Gula, Mike McKay, Tony Johnson, Tom Sanchez, Jock O'Connor, Peter Tomanovits, Richard Howden, and coxswain Peter Scott. As a result of the outstanding performances achieved by this crew Andrew Cooper, Mike McKay and Peter Tomanovits were selected in the Australian Senior B heavyweight eight which will be based at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra. Our congratulations and best wishes go to these members for success in their forthcoming overseas trip.

The Club was most fortunate to secure Steve Spurling as coach of our Youth Eight. Steve, a most successful international lightweight oarsmen, who has only recently retired from competitive rowing, selected the majority of his crew from the new recruits who had recently joined the Club.

They certainly continued the high standard of success achieved by our Youth eight of last season. The crew, consisting of Bob Law, Andrew Imison, Chris Gilford, Paul Williams, David McLeod, Paul Somerville, Michael Stranks, Stuart Wade, and coxswain Stuart Greenbaum, won every race they entered, including the Victorian Youth and Junior Eight Championships.

Subsequent to the terrific success achieved during the season, the Mercantile Youth Eight was selected with one change to represent Victoria in the Interstate Youth Eight Championship at the Kings Cup Regatta. Again another faultless performance was produced resulting in a great win for Victoria and our young Mercantilians. They are to be congratulated on an outstanding season, for the success they have achieved and rightly deserve. I am sure we will see these young oarsmen in many more successful Mercantile crews of the future.

Completing the crews who rowed in under age events this season was the Fisa Junior four coached by the perennial PhilAinsworth. At the start of the season, Phil selected his crew from the new recruits who had recently joined the club. During the season they performed very well at every regatta in which they competed including the National Selection regattas. During the season they won the Champion Fisa Junior Four and Champion Fisa Coxless pair of Victoria. At the National Championships they also won the Champion Junior four of Australia. As a result of these great wins, Phil and his crew, consisting of Geoff Barden, Andrew Cohen, Simon Kay, Stuart Paton and coxswain Peter Scott, have been selected to represent Australia at the World Fisa Junior Championships to be held in East Germany in August this year. During the season the crew was coxed by Justin Carter and Simon Teschendorf. Paul Somerville, a member of the successful Youth Eight has also been selected to join the squad.

Martin Owen was re-appointed coach of our lightweights again this season and continued the development of this squad based on a re-building programme he instituted three years ago. Prior to Christmas, the lightweight eight of Mark Baxter, Gary Harris, John Grant, Russ Evans, Matthew Weatherly-White, Joe Joyce, Derek Mollison, Alan Borger and Ken Marshall won the Victorian Lightweight Eight Championship. After Christmas, Joe Joyce, Alan Borger and Derek Mollison were joined by Tony Inglis combining to form the senior lightweight oxless four. This crew competed in fours and pairs at the National Selection regattas and consistently produc-

ed excellent results usually finishing each regatta as one of the top two or three crews. Their consistency was rewarded when Joe Joyce, Derek Mollison and Alan Borger were selected in the Australian Senior lightweight eight to race at the World Lightweight Championships. Martin Owen was also selected to coach the Australian Senior B lightweight coxless four which will compete in a series of regattas against New Zealand. The success enjoyed by these oarsmen is the result of two years hard work and determination. It should inspire them to even greater success next season.

This season held added significance in that it marked the first time Mercantile has boated womens crews. Success at Mercantile seems infectious and not to be outdone by their male counterparts, our women produced some fine wins. Susie Palfreyman coached a crew consisting of Linda MacLeod, Rachel McInnes, Kerrie-Ann Smyth, Tracey Smit and coxswain Louise Monotti. This crew raced against stiff opposition during the season and produced some excellent wins.

Steve Mollard coached the Senior B lightweight four of Kate Worboys, Sue Lee, Jenny Hose, Roberta Steuart and coxswain Holly Martin. This crew raced against much more experienced crews throughout the season and showed great perseverance and determination. Their efforts were rewarded with a fine win at the National Championships where they won the Women's Australian Senior B Lightweight Four Championship.

Our congratulations go to all the oarswomen for a great first season at the Club. I am sure we can look forward to seeing many more wins in the future.

David Fogarty, Tim Frederico and David Pincus supervised the Junior and Maiden oarsmen within the Club and recorded some fine wins throughout the season. As I highlighted in my report last year I feel it is very important to acknowledge the role played by this group of coaches and oarsmen. The Club must continue to support all levels of oarsmen whether they be rowing in our Senior eight or in our Maiden four. Obviously the pressures of Australian selection criteria and equipment availability make this a difficult task to undertake at times. But everyone who wishes to represent the Club at a competitive level must be supported to the fullest extent. We congratulate all those Junior and Maiden oarsmen who enjoyed success this season and look forward to their ongoing participation and support.

Our novice oarsmen, supervised by Vic Ronai and Lindsay Wallis, continued to record some good wins throughout the season.

It was also good to see our 'young' veterans competing regularly throughout the season winning most of their races on the way.

To our sponsors, Esso and Carlton and United Breweries Limited, we must extend sincere appreciation and thanks for their generous ongoing support. This support has greatly contributed to the success of the Club, enabling us to upgrade our equipment on an ongoing basis, to the extent where we now have one of the finest fleets in Australia. We are very proud to have them as sponsors and look forward to a continuing and mutually beneficial relationship.

The many successes highlighted in this report have been achieved by a large group of oarsmen and oarswomen. But there is also another group of members who have contributed to our success. Not only do we have the best oarsmen and oarswomen but we also have a very strong and hard working administration.

I would like to thank those members for the time and effort they have made during the last twelve months and look forward to their continuing support.

The great success we have achieved during this season has created a precedent that will be hard to beat. But with ongoing support and commitment from all our members, I am sure Mercantile will maintain its rightful position as the most successful and greatest rowing club in Australia.

#### **ESSO SCOTCH MERCANTILE REGATTA**

The Club was again instrumental in organizing a successful Regatta this year. The sponsorship of ESSO Australia was vital in continuing to make this Regatta the largest in Australia, and we thank ESSO for their continued support. Also our thanks go to the organizing committee headed by Mr. Andrew Guerin and Mr. David Pincus.

#### BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

As a very competitive Club, Mercantile has always endeavoured to maintain a high profile with the latest State-of-the-Art boats and equipment. The past year exemplified this in the purchase of three reinforced plastic boats (a racing eight, a lightweight coxless four and a coxless pair) and further sets of Dreissigacker carbon fibre oars. There is no doubt that these purchases contributed significantly to the success of crews who rowed with this equipment.

There is a general trend towards the purchase of reinforced plastic boats as they have proved better able to withstand the rigors of regular use but more importantly, they cost less than their wooden counterparts.

With a general policy of each crew maintaining their own boats and oars under the supervision of Lindsay Wallis, the fleet has been kept in good working order.

During the Year the 'R.R.Aitken' and 'W.T.Morrison' were sold to Caulfield Grammar School and the City of Warrnambool Rowing Club respectively.

The new plastic eight, the 'Andrew Guerin', was used by our successful youth crew and the plastic four the 'Fosters Lager' by the Lightweights. The Club has also purchased a plastic K.I.R.S. coxless pair which is as yet unnamed. A Sargent and Burton fibreglass training scull was won by our Senior B eight at the Henley Regatta. This is the first scull in recent years to be owned by the Club and available to members.

At present the Club owns five eights and it is intented to keep to this number for the foreseeable future. In the highly competitive rowing environment that now exists emphasis is on small boats to improve rowing skills and the Club's bias in boat purchases in future will be along these lines. Eights will only be purchased as replacement is necessary.

Whilst the Club has been and intends to be in the forefront of competition in Australia, it will always provide, wherever possible, equipment for social rowing. The veteran brigade will continue to enjoy their Sunday morning frolic.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT

The Club's finances continued to improve during the past season. Whilst this was due in part to the increased subscription receipts, it was also due to the continued high level of income from donations, sponsorships and social activities.

The Club's financial records were also improved during the season and it is expected that by the end of the current season these improvements will be completed. We note the excellent work by David Bowen and Phil Ainsworth in computerising the billing system.

The Building Fund overdraft was reduced during the season as a result of donations and also transfers from the Club's general account and is now below \$10,000. If the same rate of repayment continues, the overdraft will soon be eliminated.

The major capital acquisitions were the racing eight the 'Andrew Guerin', the racing coxless four the 'Fosters Lager', two sets of carbon fibre blades, a new boat trailer and an outboard motor.

The major sources of income of the Club have changed considerably over recent years and we are now dependent upon donations, sponsorships and income from social activities to finance our capital purchases. If it were not for these sources of income, subscription levels would have to double to maintain the standard of our fleet.

The committee considers that it would be imprudent to rely on the continuation of the support from sponsors and donors to finance our capital purchases and it is for this reason that subscription increases for 1986-87 season are recommended.

We thank the South West Corner sub-committee and social sub-committee for another wonderful result from their activities.

#### GENERAL

1984/85 has been a great season for Mercantile, possibly our best ever! The Club's victories have been detailed elsewhere in this report, but I would like to examine why the Club has been so successful and how we can improve next season.

Mercantile is Australia's premier Club because we have people with the talent and drive necessary to manage the Club well. Members both on and off the Committee have given their time and their skills to the sport without hope of financial reward. In fact most of our coaches pay dearly for the honour of coaching a Club crew. We can be justifiably proud of our achievements, however, success is a transient phenomenon that can easily slip from our grasp.

There are a number of ways that members can assist in keeping Mercantile at the top of Australian rowing. The easiest but most important is to pay subscription and entry fees promptly. Some members apparently believe that it is their right to use the Club's facilities without paying or to pay only after the threat of being written off. Please do your bit for the Club by paying any bills upon receipt.

The first season of women's rowing at Mercantile has been a resounding success. Not only did they win a number of Senior A races during the season but our Senior B Lightweight four won the Australian title. With this kind of performance, Mercantile will soon be Australia's premier women's Club as well.

Despite our Club's success we face a potentially disastrous threat right on our own doorstep. The last few years have seen rowing gradually being pushed off the Yarra. The number of ferries has increased and with it the number of accidents and near misses. The ferry operators hold us in contempt and it is only a matter of time before a serious accident occurs. Also, the current government is encouraging greater use of the Yarra in the name of 'progress'. Even though the bay is one of the best boating areas in the world, power boats are encouraged to come up the Yarra throwing up large washes and making training difficult. Every year the Board of Works gives permission for more and more groups such as the water skiers to use the Yarra thus restricting our activities. The classic case in point would be the Barefoot Water Skiing Championships which attracted a crowd of almost 20 people on finals day and deprived us of the use of the Henley course for a week just before the National Championships. Although we are by far the largest user of the Yarra, we are never consulted as to its use. Regrettably, the VRA has been unable to do anything to stem the tide and it may be necessary for the Club to take action itself to prevent the demise of rowing on the Yarra.
