Let us DO IT, not TALK about it.

Let us support our incoming President, the Captain, and Committee.

117th Annual Report

JIM BOURKE

(18th January 1946 - 2nd June 1997)

A very popular Mercantillian from the 1960's and 1970's has sadly passed away.

Jim rowed in the Xavier First VIII in 1963, 1964 and 1965 and in 1964 the crew won the Founders Challenge Cup at the Scotch Mercantile Regatta.

In 1966 Jim stroked the Mercantile Junior VIII coached by Graeme McCall and this crew became the Australian Champion Junior VIII. He also stroked the Junior IV which became the State Champions.

In 1967 and 1968 Jim rowed in the Senior VIII which won the State Championships.

In the 1970's he rowed successfully with Monash University and was emergency for the King's Cup crew.

Jim coached the 1982 Xavier crew with Mike McKay aboard and may well have inspired his later career.

Jim was much loved and admired by those he met. He was a person of high integrity, a regular church goer and he was renowned for being quick to defend the indefensible.

We have lost a very popular member and our condolences go to Romayne and Dash.

LLOYD STUART WILLIAMS

(23 January 1992 - 6 October 1996)

Lloyd was born and educated in Sydney. He was a fine scholar and athlete, excelling in swimming and rowing, and he was 1946 NSW Rhodes Scholar after graduating from Sydney University. He kept his lifelong interest in rowing alive at Oxford University where he rowed for Brasenose College, and developed his interest in high strength materials.

Lloyd rowed at Mercantile in the Senior VIII, retiring in 1955. Taking up coaching at M.U.B.C he was successful at both Intervarsity and King's Cup level, where he coached the successful 1957 King's Cup crew stroked by Ian "Porky" Douglas Q.C. Jack Morganti, Freddie (Mr. Justice) Frederico, David Boykett and Brian Dawes were all Mercantile members of that crew.

Lloyd then teamed up with Ron March of Richmond Rowing Club to be a most successful King's Cup selection team. Lloyd followed on with Professor Cotton's ideas on crew selection by enlisting the help of Drs. Gandevia and Trethewie of

Melbourne University to develop criteria for talent identification and selection by using E.C.G.s, lung volume and physical measurement as the factors. Later, while working at Repco he helped develop the air brake system that is the basis for the ergometers now used in world wide talent identification.

Lloyd was also involved in the formation of the Monash University Boat Club and was the first president of that Club.

Lloyd was always the gentleman of rowing whilst pursuing his ideas with passionate dedication. He had a very good eye for rowing and was able to address the improvement of technique in the individual with great patience, by very effective coaching which sought perfection.

In his sixties Lloyd worked hard to regain fitness, and won gold at the Masters Games held in Canada. Even in his last years he had been experimenting with ceramic metals and cements to develop new materials. Rowing and Engineering will miss him greatly. He made an outstanding contribution in both areas.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The committee is pleased to submit the 117th Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ending 30th April 1997.

At the State Championships in February, Mercantile took out six titles including the prized men's youth eight title, the women's elite single scull, the men's intermediate coxed eight, the men's senior coxless pair, the women's elite coxless four, and the men's elite coxed eight. Many of these races were won in convincing style, while other races such as that of Simon Gadsden and Bill Tait, were of the more nail biting variety.

The form of Mercantile's elite rowers was evident at the Australian Championships where four National titles were won. The fine performances by our rowers in the men's A coxed four, the women's A coxed eight, the men's B coxed eight, and the men's A lightweight eight, led to a number of people being called up for the final selection trial. As part of the King's Cup and Interstate Regatta, Mercantile had representatives in both the Victorian Youth Eight and the Victorian Women's Coxless Four. Ben Mulcahy, Anthony Schrober and Michael Kelly were members of the victorious youth eight crew, while Gina Douglas was part of the winning coxless four.

Following the National Selection Trials in Penrith, Simon Gadsden was selected to represent Australia in the Senior B men's eight, while Noel Donaldson was named coach of the crew which will race at the Nations Cup in July. Gina Douglas, Drew Ginn and David Colvin were all selected to represent Australia at the World Championships in France, which will be held in September.

While our elite crews have the spotlight focussed on them, Mercantile has a number of veteran crews that train regularly, and compete at various regattas. Some of these members are presently preparing for the FISA World Masters regatta which will be held in Adelaide in November.

It is wonderful to see the enjoyment and satisfaction that all our rowers get from participating in the sport. Yet it is even more pleasing to see all our members enjoying and participating in the social activities of the club. The most recent of these was the Annual Dinner in May, which was a huge success. It would be fantastic to see as many members as possible attending functions during the coming season.

This trophy is made available by the generosity of the family of the late Dr. R. A. Cooper and is awarded annually to the member who, during the year, has rendered the most outstanding service to the Club.

This year the Dr. R.A.Cooper trophy has been awarded to Philippe Batters. Philippe as well as giving freely of his time for duty on the Committee, has been involved with the organisation of the Olympic celebration dinner and has introduced a merry band of men to the joys of a social row on a Thursday night.

N. W. CAIRNES TROPHY

This trophy is awarded to the most improved coxswain of the season.

This the trophy has been awarded to Daisey McHarg who his relatively new to the sport of rowing but has shown great improvement coxing the veteran men on a Thursday night.

JEEF WYLIE MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Perpetual Shield and Trophy for the most improved lightweight rower is donated by the management and staff of Edward Lumley and Sons Pty Ltd and is awarded annually in memory of the late Jeff Wylie, a former captain of the Club. This trophy has not been awarded this year.

LATE F. R. BROWNE TROPHY

The Perpetual Shield and Trophy is donated by the family of the late F. R. Browne for presentation to the most improved oarsman.

This trophy has been awarded to Ben Mulcahy. Ben came to Mercantile from Xavier College last year and rowed in the Youth Eight this that had a number of fine wins including the State Championship, Ben was also selected in Victorian Youth Eight which won the Wilkinson Cup at the Interstate Regatta in April. We hope to see Ben enjoying even more success in the next few years.

H.R. FREDERICO TROPHY

This trophy made available by the Honorable Justice H. R. Frederico is awarded annually to the most improved oarswoman at the Club.

This trophy has been awarded to Bronwyn Monger. Bronwyn was a member of our senior womens squad and recorded some fine performances this year including a win at the Ballarat Regatta.

KEITH BILNEY COACHES TROPHY

This trophy was established in the memory Keith Bilney who gave nearly 70 years of service to rowing as a coxswain, sculler, oarsman, administrator but, most of all as a coach. He gave of his time freely instilling in his charges a love of the sport, a burning desire to win but with a balanced approach to life. This trophy is awarded to the coach that is not necessarily the most successful in terms of race wins, but the one who does the most to teach oarsmen & oarswomen how to row, win races and achieve their potential and in so doing develop the foundations of the Club and build and maintain the attitudes of sportsmanship, dedication and loyalty.

This year the trophy has been awarded to Richard Wraith. Richard coached our mens youth eight during the season which won the state championship. Surprisingly Richard was not selected to coach the State Crew however three of Richard's crew were selected in the crew that went on to win the Wilkinson Cup. The attitude and approach of his crew was a tribute to Richard's coaching and exemplify what this award is all about. Fittingly Richard is Keith Bilney's grandson.

GENERAL REPORT

Over the last few months there have been some changes in the administration of the Club. Richard Wraith resigned as Captain of the Club in February so that he could complete his Ph.D., also in February Jeff Lawrence headed off overseas and is expected to be away for at least two years. These two members have been tremendous workers for the Club over a number of years and their absence left a gap that has been difficult to fill. Celia Patterson has stepped into the role of Captain, our first female Captain, and has begun the process of revitalising the Club both on and off the water. I urge all members to give their full support to Celia in the coming year.

Our President Mr. David Boykett has announced that he will be standing down as President at the Annual General Meeting. David has been President for 5 years and oversaw the redevelopment of the boatshed into the magnificent Clubhouse we now enjoy. It has been a pleasure to work with David in the administration of the Club and I congratulate him on his election to Life Membership of the Club which is a fitting tribute to his many years of dedication to the Club.

The next few years present a challenge to the Club, as the success of the past decade, which we have almost come to take for granted, would appear to have come to an end. With the renovations to the Clubhouse now complete the Club must now focus on regaining our position as the most formidable rowing club in the land. Over the last ten years many members were part of our winning crews, now we need these members who experienced success at Mercantile to come back to the Club and pass on their experience and the Mercantile ethos to the next generation. I appeal to all those who won races for Mercantile in the last ten years to come back to the Club and make a contribution to the future success of our Club. The Club needs your involvement if we are to once again have the sort of success which we have come to expect over the last few years. That success did not just happen it was the product of the efforts of many members doing a variety of roles from coaching to administration.

MERCANTILE ROWING CLUB BOATS AND EQUIPMENT REPORT 1996/97

Mercantile this season was able to again increase many parts of its equipment levels while maintaining its present boats and equipment in excellent condition. This was kindly helped along by the continuous personal assistance of Mercantile members and there desire to see Mercantile at the top of rowing. The two most noticeable changes are the addition of two new ergo's and a new nomex eight.

The new ergo's are part of a change over, update of our aging ergo's. This has kindly been organised by David Boykett, with some fundraising to cover the costs of the change over. This is a great addition, and helps push Mercantile towards 2000.

The other new addition for the boat racks is a near new Sykes nomex eight. The boat, an ex-AIS boat was picked up by the club due to some kind financial assistance by Jeffrey Lawrence, This purchase now gives Mercantile an up to date boat to compete at state and national levels.

With this addition to the fleet, the movements were made to name not only this new boat, but also the other boats which were yet to be named. This has now left the club with the three newly named boats as so:

New eight: J.J. LAWRENCE Coxless four: PHILLIPE BATTERS Coxless pair: BARRY GROSS

In addition the TED SORANI was updated to a new Sykes reg. four. This, a coagreement with Firbank, which shall have use of the boat during school hours, was equally financed by both boat clubs.

Again a through overhaul of all the coxless pairs has left the club with a fleet of boats in excellent condition. With the increased demand this year on boats it is going to be very important for all rowers to look after there equipment in a meticulous manner. If you loose or brake a part please notify the equipment manager who can supply you with the necessary parts. This is vitally important if the fleet of boats is to be keep at an excellent level.

Thanks must also go out also to Walter Rotter for the repairs he has done on various boats in the shed and Those who helped with boat repairs.

Rowing - General

What a sensational result! Back to back Olympic Gold Medals! Michael McKay, James Tomkins, Noel Donaldson (Coach), and Nick Green (MUBC) were joined by Drew Ginn to win the Coxless Fours Title at the Atlanta Olympics. Whilst the majority of members have not joined the club expecting to achieve Olympic Gold, the results of our top elite members inspire the membership as a whole, raise the profile of our club and sport, as well as help define the ethos of Mercantile.

The State Championship Titles of our Elite Women's Four, and our Senior, Youth and Intermediate Men's Eight's, represent a broad level of rowing success. It is disappointing however, that there were not nearly as many members competing at the Nationals.

Recruiting

The 1996-97 recruiting began in earnest shortly after the Head of the River with regular Sunday morning sessions for both the men's and women's squads. An invitation to attend a September recruiting day was extended to all members of school boat clubs. Thanks to Tim Frederico, Peter Somerville & Rob Manning for their invaluable assistance with the recruiting. Selection of the Club's various crews began in October and were finalised at a rowing camp conducted on the Barwon two weeks prior to the State Championships.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The finances of the club should settle now following the completion of the boat house renovations. Final improvements this season involved the heating and cooling system and the placement of memorabilia on the club house walls. Despite these improvements, we were still able to reduce our loans on the construction of the boat house by some \$5,000. The focus on the finances in the forthcoming years will now be moved very clearly onto debt reduction and improvements to the gymnasium and equipment of the Club. This was commenced during the year with the purchase of the new eight, "Jeff Lawrence II" with the generous assistance of Jeff Lawrence, and the training four, "Ted Sorani" with generous assistance of the Cooper Fund and the proceeds of the successful "Barrels Bash".

The income statement for the Club for the year shows a healthy increase in income from members functions and subscriptions. The subscriptions figure is somewhat inflated in the light of the fact that our collections were not as effective in the past season as we would have liked and we have a belief that these funds are recoverable in the current year. Accordingly we have booked to income a reasonable amount of arrears subscriptions and members expenses. But for this bringing forward, the surplus would have been more as we would have expected. I of course urge all members to **pay your subscriptions** and expenses incurred as soon as possible or at least make an arrangement for their payment. We have taken the liberty this year of moving the Bilney Trust Fund out of the club's Balance Sheet into a separate fund.

The donations for the year were again of great assistance to the Club. We again thank **Carlton** & **United Breweries** (one of the world's great brewers) for their continued financial support to the Club, both in product as well as in finance. This year completed the final of a five year agreement with CUB and we thank them for their continued support.

Sean Colgan, "Trader Al" again greatly assisted the Club with another generous donation. His insistence that Andrew Guerin match his donation proved also beneficial to the Club. In addition to the above donations, the Club also received generous assistance from a number of members as follows: John Leeming, Bob Aitken, Norm Cairnes, Harry Mahoney, Bill White, Graeme Richardson, Mrs Ruth Wraith, Richard Wraith, Phil Ainsworth, Stephen Gillon, Alex Dobbie, and Jeff Lawrence. Thank you to all those members.

The Endowment Fund continues to grow with dividend receipts and further donations. We thank all those members who donated again to the Endowment Fund. It is pleasing to note that the investments of the fund have now reached **\$100,000**. A generous post balance date donation from **David Boykett** further boosts the fund. I encourage all members to make their annual donation to the fund which will provide the Club with an assured strong future.
