PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Whilst I will let the Captain discuss the rowing performances of the season, I will dwell briefly on Mercantile's representatives in the 2002 Australian teams. Then I will make some comments on coaching before reflecting on some great work undertaken by some members this past season.

Head Coach of the Australian team and Club member *Noel Donaldson* leads the mens team to Spain this year. His selection of

James Tompkins and *Drew Ginn* in the pair for the World Championships gives them the opportunity to race against many excellent crews including current World Champions James Cracknell and Matthew Pinsent from Britain. Their event will be a highlight of the Championship and we look forward to it with great anticipation. Both Drew and James now have young families and cherish the ability to train from Mercantile and so limit their interstate and overseas commitments.

It was great to see *Rob Douglas* and *Travis Johnstone* gain selection in the mens eight after distinguished local and senior B careers. The withdrawal of Matt Long following selection deprived us of three members in that crew. This crew has many young and exceptional quality athletes and we eagerly await racing to see this crew in action.

The selection of *Sara Richards* and *Danielle Ackland* in the senior B team represents the culmination of a good season for both them and all the women rowing at the Club. It also announces the beginning of the careers of two international athletes. Their Australian crew is a very good senior B four and will win. *Tom Courtney* is assisting this crew with their preparation. Had it not been for a policy decision to base the crew in Sydney, Tom would have coached it.

Womens rowing at Mercantile has had a good season taking the Victorian Womens Premiership for the first time. The appointment of *Tom Courtney* as the professional head coach of our women members is an indication of your Committee's confidence in the quality and future of our women members.

Not only are our women rowers on the verge of great success, but also our men. There are very positive signs that the Club is on track for another golden era of success such as we enjoyed in the 1980's. If the current good work continues, I can confidently predict that Mercantile will again truly be the Mecca of rowing in the next Olympiad leading through to Beijing. We now need administrators willing to lead the Club during this period. I would welcome any expressions of interest from members.

This brings me onto the main discussion point of my report, namely coaching and in particular, professional coaching. It has always been the case that the Club's rowing success depended upon our coaches through recruitment and development of our athletes. It is also evident for anyone working these days, that it is difficult to maintain any job and coach extensively. Finally,

with the standard of competition rising, compromises in preparation are less able to be hidden. These and other factors have led your committee to the view that we need a mix of both amateur and professional coaches to succeed. Amateur coaches will continue to be the backbone of our coaches but will now have appropriate support. Your committee was also of the view that that to get optimal benefit from professional coaches, two were needed.

Your committee was in no doubt over their decision to appoint *Tom Courtney* to join *Ian Dryden* in our professional coaching ranks. Tom will oversee the womens programme and reports to Ian. As you might expect, this commitment is a significant financial commitment for a Club of our resources. Accordingly, the appointment is only part time coaching with Tom wearing a fund raising hat for the balance of his time. By this means we hope to generate improved or new income streams for the Club as well as improved coaching.

Our experience with professional coaches has been very good. In particular we are privileged to have

Ian Dryden as our Head Coach. He has negotiated this difficult role with great effect and the full impact of his work will be felt over the next season. An indicator of his influence has been the higher level of professionalism in our coaching and the improved preparation of our crews. Even in related areas of endeavour such as boat and equipment storage has seen the impact of Ian's work. Well done Ian and keep up the good work.

One of the new income sources for the Club last year has been tax deductible donations to the Sports Foundation with the intended recipient being the Club. Forms were sent out with the subscription notices and again with this report. Last year this generated some \$24,000 in donations. The Club's equipment budget is now heavily reliant on this source and I urge members to support this initiative.

Our donors this year are recognised in the financial report. Once again I must mention *Sean Colgan* who again tested our fundraising skills by donating \$5000 to the Club on the condition that we raised an additional \$10,000 from other members. We thank those members who donated \$15,000 to exceed this target. Thank you Sean for your continued support and interest in the Club.

At this meeting your committee has nominated *Phil Batters* to be a new Vice-President of the Club. Phil is a great Club member, he engenders his infectious enthusiasm on us all and he works tirelessly for the Club. He will continue to enthuse us in his new position.

Your Vice-Presidents were called upon this season for their assistance in evaluating several proposals to provide new income streams for the Club. None of these ideas stood up to the scrutiny of the Vice-Presidents and their strict criteria. In particular I would like to thank *David Yunghanns* and *Mike McKenna* who devoted considerable time and effort doing this work.

Your Captain *David Colvin* again undertook a superb job as Captain which now incorporates the added responsibility of supervising our professional coaches. His combination of both rowing and business expertise has held him in good stead to undertake this difficult role. We are fortunate to have David doing this demanding role and also have his commitment to continue through this Olympiad. In the time leading up to the arrival of Ian, David maintained a very heavy workload as Captain and we are most appreciative of his fine work.

Accompanying David this year was our Secretary *Bill Webster*. Bill has been Secretary of the Club on 11 occasions with two of these occasions taking over from other Secretaries later in the season. Even accounting for these 2 part year appointments as one season, he would have been Secretary for at least 10 full seasons. This equals the record held by the *Late Walter Joseph* who was Secretary for 10 seasons from the start 1909-10 season to the end of 1918-19 season. Bill has agreed to continue as Secretary next season which will clearly eclipse the long-standing achievements of Wally Joseph. Congratulations Bill and keep up the good work.

Our Treasurer *Jason Faranda* also undertook this role with distinction this year with the highlight being the creation of the Club's accounts on a commercial accounting package which will enable the Club's finances to be readily assessed, reported upon and audited. As the Club's finances are getting ever so much more complex, it is important that we utilise such resources to manage our affairs. Thank you Jason for your fine work.

Finally, thank you to all those numerous members who assisted the Club during the past season. Without your fine work we would not have achieved anywhere near the successes that were attained. The Club looks forward to the continued support of members next season.

TO THE MEMBERS

Your committee has pleasure in submitting the 122nd Annual report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April 2002.

This has been my second year as Captain of Mercantile and has seen Mercantile take some giant strides forward from this time last year. If I referred to the 2000/2001 season as a watershed year, then the season just completed was also a critical year in the development of the Club.

In a post Olympic year, there was a new generation of Mercantilians making their mark in Australian teams. Rob Douglas, Bill Tait and Matt Long made up the core of the Men's Eight at the 2001 World Championships with Rob and Matt overcoming rib stress fractures to get to the start line, winning the B Final. David Crawshay also made his Senior debut in the Quad Scull.

As reported last year, Mercantile had appointed a new Head Coach, Ian Dryden previously from Cambridge University. After overcoming immigration barriers, "Scud" and his family eventually arrived with the season up and running in late September. He hit the ground running and had barely had time to draw breath when the season finished. His immediate impact has been enormous with greater numbers in training, and a far more professional and organised approach by all club athletes to their preparation and training.

A highlight for me has been the return to the water of James Tomkins and Drew Ginn. In their post Olympic year, James has had a sabbatical coaching at Princeton University and the 2001 US Men's Four, and Drew recovering from back surgery. Drew led the charge over winter training last year and their return to form in the pair has led to their selection for this year's world championships in Seville in September. Their race against the Great Britain pair of Matthew Pinsent and James Cracknell will be the highlight of the World Championships. We wish them all the best.

Also off to the World Championships are Rob Douglas and Travis Johnstone who have been selected in a squad of 10 for the Men's Eight. If they miss out on the eight, they will race in the Coxed Four. We wish them both the best, especially Travis making the Senior Team for the first time.

Representing Australia for the first time will be Sara Richards and Danielle Ackland in the Women's Under 23 coxless four at the Nations Cup regatta at Genoa. After dominating the Under 23 pair and four at the National Championships (with their winning margins totalling about 25 seconds), their subsequent selection represents a fantastic reward for them as well as vindication of our women's program run by Tom Courtney. The girls are currently finding their training and preparation for overseas very challenging which will prepare them well for bigger challenges leading to Athens in 2004.

In my report last year, I commented on the fact that for the first time, Mercantile's women now outnumber the men. That trend has continued this year, and at this stage there are probably more

women in the club looking to follow the lead of Sara and Danni, than there are men trying to gain representative honours in Australian teams. There is now more competition than ever before for the use of the club's better boats, so the training environment continues to improve.

While Ian has stepped into the role of Head Coach with a lot of energy and purpose, Tom Courtney has also been instrumental in the establishment of our Womens program. Sara and Danni are his first two national selections and we expect to see more following in their footsteps. With nearly 30 athletes currently in winter training the women's program is travelling well. We have been delighted that Tom has agreed to take on a professional role with Mercantile heading up the Womens program and working alongside Ian. I am already enjoying working with them in coaching and setting up systems for the future.

Always, there are many people who contribute to the running of a club such as ours and who volunteer their time and expertise. To the following I offer the club's thanks:

- To vice-captains Drew Ginn and Rob Douglas (before he moved to the AIS to train in Canberra). Their support is vital for both coaches and athletes in the Club, and all the more appreciated as they pursue their own personal goals on the water.
- The coaching panel of experts of Ian Dryden, Tom Courtney, David Palfreyman, David Ochert, Anthony Bergelin, Matt Lovell, Paul Somerville, Bill Tait, Andy McNeil & John Leeming. Without the input of this group, we don't have a Club. We are always looking for other coaches, so if you wish to contribute, please contact Ian or Tom at the Club.
- Phil Batters for his fundraising efforts and other work around the clubhouse. Also to John Lausberg for his maintenance work on the clubhouse.
- Bill Webster and Jason Faranda for their administration work. Jason is stepping down as Treasurer after a number of years in the role, so I thank him for his efforts in establishing our financial systems. I also thank Paul Somerville and Tim McKinley for stepping forward and offering their time in managing the Club finances.
- And finally to the President, Andrew Guerin. Andrew does an amazing amount of work for Mercantile in establishing and pushing the Club in its future directions. He also acts as the conscience and cattle-prod for Ian and I in running Mercantile without getting in the way. I get the feeling he is impatient for Mercantile success and even domination (which is not a bad thing), so I thank him for his work, and look forward to continuing to push Mercantile forward.

After a number of complacent years, the feeling around Mercs is that we are on the way back. There is still a long way to go, especially on the mens side of the Club and in our recruiting, but we are definitely moving forward. Mercs is a good place to be right now, so I encourage all long absent members to pay us a visit one Thursday night for a quiet one, and even a row if you like. You may be surprised.

CAPTAIN'S TROPHY

This trophy is awarded annually to the member who has won the most Regatta and Club races during the season on the basis of one point for a win with one additional point for any championship.

The Captain's Trophy has been won jointly by James Tomkins and Drew Ginn. James and Drew made a highly successful return to competition this season with many fine wins including the National Championship at Nagambie. We wish them well in the pair at the World Championships in September in Seville.

MAX BAILEY TROPHY

The Perpetual Shield and Trophy is awarded to the coxswain who has won the most Regatta and Club races during the season on the basis of one point for a win with one additional point for any championship.

The Max Bailey Trophy has been won by Alex Law. Alex coxed our Senior Men's squad and his victories included the memorable win in the Senior Eight at the State Championships at Ballarat.

DR R. A. COOPER MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy is made available by the generosity of the family of the late Dr. R. A. Cooper and is awarded annually to the member who, during the year, has rendered the most outstanding service to the Club.

This year the Dr. R.A.Cooper trophy has been awarded to Warwick Hutchins. Warwick has been a member for over thirty years and has made many valuable contributions to the club in that time. Most notably to the rebuilding of the Clubhouse after the fire in the early seventies. In making this award we recognise his particular generosity and effort in fabricating and supplying the new boat racking for the boathouse.

N. W. CAIRNES TROPHY

This trophy is awarded to the most improved coxswain of the season.

This trophy has been awarded to Alex Law. Alex made a big step up this season to become the senior coxswain in the Club.

JEFF WYLIE MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Perpetual Shield and Trophy for the most improved lightweight rower is donated by the management and staff of Edward Lumley and Sons Pty Ltd and is awarded annually in memory of the late Jeff Wylie, a former captain of the Club.

This trophy has been awarded this season to Emily Wilmoth. In 2001 Emily was a member of the State Youth crew, in 2002 Emily made the transition to lightweight sculling and narrowly missed out on selection in the State Lightweight Quad Scull. Emily made the finals at the National Championships in the U23 LW Single Scull and Double Scull as well as the finals in the Open LW Quad and U23 HW Quad.

LATE F. R. BROWNE TROPHY

The Perpetual Shield and Trophy is donated by the family of the late F. R. Browne for presentation to the most improved oarsman.

This trophy has been awarded to Tyson Chambers. Tyson joined the Club in November 2001 after recovering from a broken leg. He showed considerable application in training and lost 15kg in weight. Tyson narrowly missed selection in the State Youth Eight and is now working hard on his pre-season and should look forward to selection honours next season.

H. R. FREDERICO TROPHY

This trophy made available by the Honorable Justice H. R. Frederico is awarded annually to the most improved oarswoman at the Club.

This trophy has been awarded to Sara Richards. In the last season Sara graduated from the 2001 Victorian Youth Eight to selection in the Australian U23 Four to compete later this year at the Nations Cup in Italy. In between she has handled moving to Melbourne to live, and has competed in her first selection regattas in small boats, winning the National U23 pairs with Danni Ackland by 13 seconds and the U23 Fours by 12 seconds.

KEITH BILNEY COACHES TROPHY

This trophy was established in the memory Keith Bilney who gave nearly 70 years of service to rowing as a coxswain, sculler, oarsman, administrator but, most of all as a coach. He gave of his time freely instilling in his charges a love of the sport, a burning desire to win but with a balanced approach to life. This trophy is awarded to the coach that is not necessarily the most successful in terms of race wins, but the one who does the most to teach oarsmen & oarswomen how to row, win races and achieve their potential and in so doing develop the foundations of the Club and build and maintain the attitudes of sportsmanship, dedication and loyalty.

This year the trophy has been awarded to Tom Courtney. This is the second year that Tom has won this award. In the past year Tom has guided the emergence of Sara Richards and Danni Ackland into their first Australian Team and has been recognised by Rowing Australia as a potential National Team coach by his appointment as a support coach for the 2002 U23 and Junior Teams. He is the prime generator of our current Women's squad of nearly 30 girls currently in training and was largely responsible for our win in the Rowing Victoria Senior Women's Premiership.

HEAD COACH REPORT

Coming to Mercantile at the end of October was a little late, but better late than never as some of you must have thought, is the man ever going to get here!

To arrive so late in the season was to say the least, coming down to earth like a 747 landing and taking straight off again, so many new faces and so little time to have organised in preparation for what would be a first for me at Mercantile. Not knowing the season ahead or how the Regatta program worked would be difficult enough without knowing the available talent to direct. So I decided to organise the training protocol and try to set in progress more club discipline of training together in structured groups, men and women, and to instil a culture of training as one and so being a stronger Club with more identification and purpose that we all like to be associated with.

This season has seen athletes Sara Richards, Danielle Acland, move on up through to gain U23 selection for Australia, Matthew Phillips, Kris Coventry, Alistair Taylor, Dale Hawkins, Henry Edgar, David Crawshay, to represent the club at Henley Royal Regatta, Drew and James to represent in the coxless pair at the World Championships in Seville in Spain. Congratulations and Good Luck!

GENERAL REPORT

This past year marks the end of a five year plan commenced in 1997. The five year plan was developed as a framework for the Committee to direct the revitalisation of the Club. Key elements of the plan included a move toward professional coaching and the broadening and development of the Club's revenue base. Our President is currently overseeing the development of our next five year plan.

The appointment of a second professional coach was a major but relatively straightforward decision for the Committee. The need of the Club was plainly clear and also within the objectives and framework of our plans. The position does pose a financial challenge to the Club, the Committee and to our new coach. We are confident that this challenge can be met with the support of members in our pursuit of new revenue streams and sponsors.

In the last year the Club was successful in applying for a Restricted Club Liquor Licence. Members will note that this licence was a long time coming. The licence does allow the Club to greatly expand our bar trading but it also imposes a number of obligations and responsibilities upon the Club. Members are asked to be aware of their responsibilities in regard to the signing of guests in particular.

The Cayzer Cup continues to grow in importance in the Club calendar. It provides a rela focus to winter training and also serves to develop the ties between Mercantile and Sydney Rowing Club. The efforts of our friends at Sydney Rowing Club in supporting this event are much appreciated.

In 2002 the Scotch-Mercantile Regatta moved to Nagambie. The format of the regatta was also changed to become a schools only regatta that encompassed the qualifying races for the Heads of the River. This move was forced upon the Regatta Committee as a result of the short racing season and the fact that Victoria was also the host state for the National Championships. Through the hard work of Richard Wraith, Andrew Guerin, David Crawshay and Andrew Clarke the change was successful. The 2003 Scotch-Mercantile Regatta will follow the same format.

The Club is currently exceeding its boat storage capacity. This will be plainly obvious to all active members with boats constantly stored on trestles. The problem will be partly alleviated with the installation of a new more efficient racking arrangement over winter, but the Club is now forced to review our rental arrangement with Firbank Grammar as well as moving some boats to outside storage.

BOATS AND EQUIPMENT REPORT 2001/02

In the last couple of years the Committee has developed a complete boat replacement program for our fleet. This program takes into account our current fleet, our expected needs over the next five years and our financial capacity. The policy considers the different types of boats and the needs of members in terms of both elite level competition including national selection and also recreational use. Our aim is to ensure that we have the best possible fleet of boats to satisfy our members needs. Given the priority of pair oared rowing in terms of national selection, our pairs will be maintained as the youngest group of boats in the fleet. Fours will be renewed less regularly and eights will generally be kept until the end of their life.

The main focus of boat purchases for the last year has been single sculls and quad and double riggers for other boats. This has reflected the changing emphasis from sweep rowing to sculling for national selection purposes. The Club purchased 4 new single sculls. The planned purchase of an eight to replace the JJ Lawrence 1 which was sold during the year, was deferred as a suitable replacement was not available. A suitable boat was able to be rented to cover our short term need for a women's eight.

Thanks must also go to Walter Rotter for the repairs he has done on various boats in the shed.

TREASURERS REPORT

This is the first full year of financial reporting on the new MYOB system. This system has made the task of financial record keeping much easier and has resulted in the provision of better and more detail financial reports to the Committee.

Despite the reporting of a strong surplus in the accounts the cashflow of the Club remains the major ongoing concern. Much careful attention is needed by the Executive and the Committee to maintain the Club's liquidity. The Club now has two employees and development and expansion of the revenue base is required to meet these responsibilities. The likely 30% rise in insurance premiums in the coming year will place further strain on the budget. On the positive side, by the end of this calendar year the debt on renovation of the Clubhouse will be fully repaid, which will free up some of the monthly cashflow.

This year has seen the purchase of a number of capital items including boats and a vehicle. Revenue from the Clubhouse remains strong but did suffer from dip in corporate hospitality trade post September 11. The pursuit of members subscriptions is a constant challenge for any Treasurer and the Committee. Full and swift payment of subscriptions by all members will make a significant difference to our cash position and I urge all members to ensure they are paid up.

This is my last year as treasurer. I have enjoyed the challenge but with changing employment I must now step aside for a new Treasurer. Thank you for the trust you have placed in me for the last 3 years.
