Captain's Report

WILLIAM WEBSTER

Mercantile finished the 2017-18 season as the top Victorian club and in third place overall at the National Championship Regatta behind the extremely well resourced Sydney University and Sydney Rowing Club. This is an excellent result and tribute must be paid to our athletes and coaches for their hard work and dedication over the past year. As well as our wins at the Nationals it was particularly pleasing to see numerous occasions where Mercantile took more than one spot on the podium!

Head Coach Simon Gadsden completed his service at the National Championship Regatta, moving onto work with the Victorian Institute of Sport. The excellent results achieved at the Nationals are a culmination of his time at Mercantile and demonstrate the strength of the program he set. We thank the VIS for their cooperation during the transition period, enabling the Club to have a seamless transition to our new Head Coach. Simon kept his foot firmly on the accelerator pedal all the way to the finish and has left us in very good shape. Thank you Simon.

The Head Coach is a significant figure in the modern day life of Mercantile, a full time position that is tasked with leading all our athletic activities. The Head Coach is also responsible for the coaching and management of our national pathway program athletes. After a thorough recruitment process we were very pleased to appoint Nick Mitchell as our new Head Coach. Nick rowed successfully for Mercantile in 00's and then gained experience as a professional cyclist in Europe. He came back to rowing a few years ago and was most recently the Head Coach of Banks Rowing Club where his leadership and coaching ability were clearly demonstrated. Nick commenced work at the start of April and has hit the ground running.

From the Saltwater Challenge last September to the National Championship the Club recorded wins in every regatta we contested. In the Head of the Yarra we welcomed back our National Training Centre members into our Open Men's and Women's eights. Our Women's eight won their event while our men were narrowly defeated. At local regattas our U21 Women and U23 Men dominated the podium. We recorded 18 wins at the State Championships and topped the points score.

At the National Championships Ria Thompson had a brilliant regatta winning the U23 single, double and quad.

Amanda Bateman finished second to Ria in the single and they combined in the double and quad. A great effort from these two members. Georgie Gleeson and Sophie Balson won the U21 pair and were joined on the podium by Kirstie Green and Skyla Froebel with the Bronze. These women combined with cox Adelaide Cester to win the U21. Patrick Boomer and Josh Dunkley-Smith won the Open Four to bring the Bob Aitken Trophy back where it belongs.

Mercantile members made up fifty percent of the Victorian Team in the Interstate Regatta. Six of our U21 Women's squad gained selection in the Victorian Bicentennial Cup crew that recorded a dominant victory. The squad and the State crew was again coached superbly by Brigette Carlile. Our Senior Women made up fifty percent of the victorious Queen's Cup crew that has now stretched Victoria's winning streak to 14. The Penrith Cup crew was an all Mercantile boat and we had more than fifty percent of the King's Cup crew that was very narrowly defeated by NSW.

Thirteen Mercantile athletes and one coach were selected to represent Australia across various teams this year. Liam Donald and Angus Widdicombe were in the Men's Eight, taking out the silver medal; Kat Werry sought to defend her World Championship in the Women's Four, finishing second to USA; James Rook coxed the Women's Eight, finishing with a bronze medal; and Addy Dunkley-Smith competed in the Women's Pair at the World Championships in Bulgaria. After an exceptional season and exhausting trials process Michael McNamara was selected in the Mens Lightweight Quad, but unfortunately had to withdraw from the team before the first tour due to ill health.

Following her stellar National Championships Ria Thompson was selected in the U23 Women's Double Scull; Alex Clarke was selected in the U23 Men's Coxed Four; and Maddy Brown was selected in the U23 Women's Eight to compete in Poland. For the second year in a row Brigette Carlile was selected to coach on the U21 team, this year coaching the Womens squad. Selected to row the Pair and the Eight were Kirstie Green and Skyla Froebel. Four Mercantile members were also selected to represent Australia in the World University Regatta in Shanghai. Tom Hunt and Callum Nott were selected in the Men's Pair, Jayden Grey was selected in the

Lightweight Scull and Olivia Sibillin was selected in the Women's Pair.

Our members this year also enjoyed success at the Henley Royal Regatta. Kat Werry and James Rook won the Remenham Challenge Cup with the Australian Women's Eight with a fantastic row defeating the home town favourite British eight. Angus Widdicombe made the final of the Silver Goblets in the Men's Pair and gave the Olympic champion Sinkovic brothers plenty to think about in the first half of the race. Our Club Four of Ben Canham, Jack Kelly, Mitch Hooper and Angus Maloney, coached by David Pincus had a superb run through the regatta and made the final of the Wyfold Challenge Cup. While Molesey proved too strong in the final the times for the race showed that our crew would have won the Visitors Challenge Cup which is generally a stronger field.

Just before the Nationals in March, Josh Dunkley-Smith announced his retirement from international competition. A few days before the announcement Josh broke the long standing World Record for 2000m on the ergometer at the National Selection Trials. Josh's record as an oarsman is outstanding, 2 Olympic Silver Medals in the Men's Four in London and Rio, 5 medals at the World Championships and 2 King's Cups for Victoria. Always a great role model for our younger members, at the age of 28 Josh decided it was time prioritise other things in his life. Well done on a fantastic rowing career and we look forward to seeing you around the Club as you pursue the next stage of your life.

Our Masters group was bolstered this year by some new female members and keenly contested a number of regattas including the Head of the Yarra and the Rutherglen Regatta. We now have 4 eights dedicated to our masters members and it pleasing to see these being well used throughout the year. Thanks to Colin Kimpton, Andrew Phillips and Jenny Williams for their efforts in coordinating our Masters crews and helping our members enjoy rowing and Mercantile.

The 60th Scotch-Mercantile Regatta was held in March and continues to set the standard for regattas in Victoria. Regatta Secretary Faith Gasparini managed a faultless regatta that was well supported by spectators and internet viewers through the live stream. With the valuable assistance of Scotch College this regatta is now

very well supported through sponsorship. A number of our members also contributed to the success of the regatta, thank you to Andrew Guerin, Duncan MacKinnon, Graeme Boykett, Geoff & Fiona Barden, Julie Orr, Jeff Thompson and Colin Kimpton.

Our on water activities are led by our coaches and we thank the following for their efforts over the last season; Simon Gadsden, Brigette Carlile, Simon Harrison, David Colvin, Casey Cobb, David Pincus and John Leeming.

Returning to the "Mecca of Rowing" has been something I have aspired to do for a number of years, so when the opportunity presented itself to become Head Coach of Mercantile Rowing Club in April, I seized it with both hands.

Since starting I have been welcomed to the club with open arms and I am very grateful to be working with the support and guidance of the Committee and the Club's coaches.

The 2017/2018 season was the last of Simon Gadsden's successful tenure as Head Coach of the club. Simon left to take up the position of Head Coach of the VIS. We will continue to benefit from his knowledge as he works to develop our VIS scholarship holders and watch-list athletes.

Thanks to the diligent work of Simon and his coaches: Brigette Carlile; David Colvin; Casey Cobb; Simon Harrison; David Pincus; and Bill Webster; a fantastic set of results were achieved during the 2017-2018 season.

And at Henley Royal Regatta the club was represented by Ben Canham, Jack Kelly, Mitch Hooper and Angus Maloney racing for The Wyfold Challenge Cup. The crew coached by David Pincus produced strong performance after strong performance showing a class of rowing that would have been competitive in the Vistors Challenge Cup to finish second.

The coaching structure for the coming season will retain all of the coaches from the 2017/2018 season but will shift slightly to accommodate the needs of our dynamic squad.

The coaching roster also expands through the return of former club coaches David Fraumano, Tom Courtney and David McGrath, former athletes Zac Smith and new faces Sam Lefebvre and Ben Board.

The 2018/2019 Seasons Coaching Structure is:

These coaches have been working hard over the winter months to make sure our athletes are progressing well as they chase boat speed via improved technique and physiology.

For those not racing for Australia, or for Mercantile at Henley Royal Regatta, the focus of winter training was in the gym - improving mobility and functional strength. Our focus has now shifted towards increasing aerobic capacity via long kilometres on the water and on the erg.

Our senior athletes aspiring to the national team have had slightly different foci over the past months as they prepare to chase selection for the National Training Centres (NTC) and ultimately the National Team.

Athletes in the training centres are expected to complete huge training loads, so the priorities for athletes aspiring to the NTCs for the 2018/2019 season are increasing boat speed and developing the capacity to tolerate and thrive under the significant load expected of senior team members.

Winter has also been used to develop a better understanding of how to move medium and big boats. The priority placed on training medium and big boats at a higher rate than previous seasons has resulted in a number of positive outcomes. Most notably, this has

allowed the accumulated knowledge of the club's senior athletes to be shared with our U23, U21 and school aged athletes, short cutting the learning curve for our athletes.

Training the medium and big boats has also ensured that training intent has remained high during the long winter months as athletes work alongside and with their crewmates to increase boat speed.

Increased intent is critical for our athletes aspiring to the U23 team in 2019. The standard to gain selection to the Australian U23 team is high with the selectors requiring crews demonstrate an ability to be towards the top end of A-finals. Clearly this requires our U23 athletes to strive not just to be the best in Australia but the best in the world. Again we aim to develop our athletes to not just make teams but excel in them.

As always, recruiting the next cohort of Mercantilians has been a priority through winter. David Fraumano, Zac Smith and Brigette Carlile have done a huge amount of work in this space over the last months and have signed up a number of talented athletes to strengthen the club's ranks for the coming season. It is likely that both the men's and women's U21 squads will comprise 12 members for the coming season.

Finally, I'd like to thank the athletes and coaches for the work that they have completed over the last months. I'd also like to thank the Committee for it's support and commitment to achieving greater success as a club on and off the water. The Committee's dedication is obvious with the purchase of new Hudson 8+ for the women's squad (due November 2018), two pair/doubles, eight pairs of sculling oars and a new set of sweep oars.

Finance Report

DUNCAN MACKINNON HONORARY TREASURER

As I reported last year, the Club's operational accounts have been combined with those of the Endowment Fund, and the financial statements which will be available at the Annual General Meeting will reflect that aggregation. However for the purposes of this report I can advise that the Club's operations recorded a modest surplus of approximately \$35,000, but after taking into account depreciation, this becomes an \$82,000 shortfall. I consider a better measure of the ongoing health of the Club is how the cash flow has performed over the past financial year. When that is considered for the Club's operations, it shows a modest increase of \$267, which is a reflection of the cautious financial management exhibited by the Committee.

Last year we limited capital purchases to one IV (which was paid from Club funds), but we were also very fortunate in having the Estate of the late Joan Burford donate a IV to the Club. To keep the existing fleet in good condition we spent approximately \$24,000 on repairs to boats and oars. We also spent about \$3,000 on repairs to the boathouse (after taking into account subtenant contributions). Our only extravagance was to install air conditioning in the coaches' office - but I don't think our hard-working coaching team would regard this as an extravagance!

As I do every year, let me close in drawing your attention to the list of donors at the front of the Annual Report. We are very fortunate to be the recipients of their generosity (and others who choose to remain anonymous) and I exhort you to join them to secure the continued success of the Club.

F.R. BROWNE MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Perpetual Shield and Trophy is donated by the family of the late F.R. Browne for presentation to the most improved oarsman.

For the 2017/18 season, the F. R. Browne Memorial Trophy is awarded to Joel Cain.

H.R. FREDERICO MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy, made available by the late Honorable Justice H.R. Frederico, is awarded annually to the most improved oarswoman at the Club.

For the 2017/18 season, the H.R. Frederico Memorial Trophy is awarded to Ria Thompson.

KEITH BILNEY COACHES TROPHY

This trophy was established in the memory of Keith Bilney who gave nearly 70 years of service to rowing as a coxswain, sculler, oarsman, administrator but, most of all coach. He gave of his time freely, instilling in his charges a love of the sport, and a burning desire to win, but with a balanced approach to life. The trophy is awarded to the coach that is not necessarily the most successful in terms of race wins, the one who does the most to teach oarsmen and oarswomen how to row, win races and achieve their potential, and in so doing develop the foundations of the Club and build and maintain the attitudes of sportsmanship, dedication and loyalty.

For the 2017/18 season, the Keith Bilney Coaches Trophy is awarded to Brigette Carlile.

JAY LOVELESS TROPHY

This trophy was established as a result of a bequest from the estate of the late Jay Loveless. Jay was the mother of Ricky Loveless, who coxed for the Club. Ricky was tragically killed in a road accident while riding to Mercantile and Jay remained a supporter of the Club until her passing in late 2006. It was Jay's wish that a trophy be established for the Most Outstanding Oarswoman each season.

For the 2017/18 season, the Jay Loveless Trophy is awarded to Katrina Werry.

MOST OUTSTANDING OARSMAN TROPHY



Obituaries



ARMANDO "TED" SORANI

Life Member Ted Sorani passed on 21 July 2018 aged 89.

Ted joined Mercantile in 1967 as 39 year old having been born in Romania and a raised in Italy. He learnt to row in Italy and eventually joined the Olympic squad in the post war years. He was introduced to Mercantile by his CSIRO colleague Lloyd Williams and was warmly welcomed into the "Cock Robins" veteran crew that rowed every Thursday and Sunday. Ted played to his Italian heritage brilliantly and with great self-deprecation, creating an atmosphere of fun.

The Club was at a peak at that time. The President was the magnificent orator James Sprigg, the Captain was the great motivator John Burford and the Committee include Crockett, Bradshaw, Cordell, Harding, Kellam and Newcomb. Rowing Australia and Rowing Victoria were also in the capable hands of other Mercantilians such as; Norm Cairnes, Roy Thursfield, Mick Williams, Bob Aitken, and Tom Rodda. To stand out in this crowd you needed to be Ted Sorani.

In 1969 Ted assisted with the finishing off of renovation works to the boathouse. Four years

later after the disastrous fire of 1973 Ted was on the Committee and initially led the refurbishment of the 1969 section which partially survived the fire. Ted was awarded the Dr R. A. Cooper Memorial Trophy for the Clubman of the year for his work. However this was just the start of his fine efforts.

The leadership of Ted during the rebuilding phase of the Clubhouse was quite remarkable. His work enabled the Club to save substantial amounts of money in various aspects of the contract and certain parts of the work, notably the ground floor concrete slab, the concrete columns, steel rigging, roofing, floor sanding, finishing and painting, all organisied by Ted and undertaken by club labour. Without this work, the Club would never have had the funds to finish the building. It was poetry in motion to watch him work. No harsh words, demands or anger. Just fun, calm experience and leadership that made us want to stay and work with him. Mind you the offer of beers and his great Italian sausages were also a factor.

The 1974-75 Club annual report said it was difficult to express the appreciation that the Club owes to Ted Sorani. He was awarded life

membership of the Club, the Club's highest honour.

Ted's Romanian background was not known until in 1979 the Club was hosting the newly appointed Australia head coach, Romanian, Reinhold Batschi when Ted started speaking Romanian. The relief on both Reinhold's and Australian Chairman of Selectors Jim Howden's face was palpable – Reinhold's grasp of English was non-existent at that stage. Ted's assistance to Reinhold in these first few months was a large factor in Reinhold's decision to persevere in Australia and go onto become the most influential person in Australian rowing.

Ted was a gentle, humble but determined person. He had experienced so much in life that he was always understated, and always willing to share his experience, skills and leadership with others. His kindness and genuine interest in people was unmistakable. He showed the confidence to do things others would be too risk averse to attempt, the power of enthusiasm and vision, enjoying successes and not being downhearted with mistakes, the benefits of understated leadership and the importance of club life and its friendships – these are just some of the great life lessons from Ted.

Ted's legacy to Mercantile goes well beyond our building; it resides in our members, and is profound.

A celebration of Ted's life was held at the Club on 2 August 2018 with more than 200 people present.

PAUL HARDING

Paul was one of the Club's lightweight champions from the early 1960's.

He died aged 86, in June 2018 after a long illness and was buried in his Mercs blazer in a beautiful country setting.

Paul commenced his rowing at Mercantile in 1955 and he maintained his connection throughout his life from an active and successful young oarsman, to a masters rower, to a club administrator and active participant at Club functions, particularly attending Sunday barrels until later in life.

His first lightweight win came in a four at the 1956 Christmas Nagambie Regatta. And his first Club regatta win came in the Harlequin Time Trial in crew stroked by Ron Richardson and also including Hubert Frederico. He won his first State Championship in the Junior Four in the season of 1958/59 and was selected to represent Victoria in the lightweight four in the Interstate Regatta in 1960.

Paul was elected to the Committee in 1957/58 and was Vice Captain for 1959/60.

Paul continued his strong involvement with the club throughout his life as a masters rower and as a member who just enjoyed the company of other members and the Sunday Barrel. He was a member who always assisted in his own way at times of need. For example, when the new front of the shed was built in 1969, he donated the curtains.
